INDOOR CAR SHOW SEASON

Indoor car shows are something that I have exhibited vehicles at for over 40 years. With the likelihood of inclement weather this time of the year, an indoor car show offers a safe, predictable venue to display your favorite vehicle. The first major indoor show I did was World of Wheels at McCormick Place in Chicago. It was and is a huge show with over 1,000 vehicles of all types on display. In addition to street driven cool cars and trucks of all kinds, there are over-the-top displays featuring professional touring show cars along with a myriad of vendors and isles packed wall to wall with enthusiastic crowds. It truly is a fun show and I found it exciting to be a part of the spectacle.

Other shows in major metropolitan areas echo similar over the top presentations, such as the Grand National Roadster Show at the Fairplex in Pomona, California, and the Detroit Autorama in Michigan at Cobo Hall. Here in the Pacific Northwest, the indoor shows tend to be smaller, mainly because of the more rural nature of this part of the country. However, the shows are just as much fun and offer the additional benefit of the opportunity to meet the vehicle owners due to the smaller arenas and crowds. As an example, six of us from the Rogue Valley Classic Cruisers and the Southern Oregon Corvette Association got together to display our vehicles at the Salem Roadster Show earlier this month. With one hundred vehicles on display, it was a fun, intimate show with great cars and trucks. The show promoters even provided owners who displayed vehicles with the opportunity to attend a special showing at the Brothers Collection located only a couple of miles from the show.

Another indoor show coming up at the end of April right here in Southwest Oregon is the Medford Rod and Custom Show. This year the show will be held at the new Rogue X Center in Medford and will be the first ever car show at this world-class facility. If you have ever considered joining in on the fun and displaying your favorite car or truck at an indoor show, this is the one for you. Not only is it close to home, but the Rogue Valley Classic Cruisers will have a huge display at this show, with about twenty member vehicles of all kinds in the exhibit. With hot rods, muscle cars, customs, classics and trucks, this display will have it all. We will also have a section set aside with banners and information about the club and want to encourage show exhibitors and attendees to meet club members, check out their vehicles and consider joining RVCC.

So even though the weather may not be picture perfect yet, we can still have fun with our vehicles. Indoor shows like the Medford Rod and Custom Show provide a place where we can all display them, take time to get together with other like-minded enthusiasts and make new friends. I hope to see you there.

MEMBER PROSPECTIVE

LARRY AND DEBBIE WEINER'S 2022 DODGE CHALLENGER WIDE BODY

This month's featured vehicle is the 2022 Dodge Challenger Wide Body owned by Larry and Debbie Weiner. This is no ordinary Challenger--it's a Hurst Heritage Tribute car built by GSS Supercars, Larry and Debbie's business. After finding a Challenger with the color and options they wanted, the Weiner's shipped the new car to their facility in Arizona to be transformed into a 55th Anniversary 1969 Hurst Tribute car. Larry and Debbie have built lots of Challengers and other modern muscle cars for customers, but since Challenger production was ending they decided it was time to build one for themselves. Larry says no two GSS builds are the same--each one has the specific features the customer desires, and this one is no different. After starting with the White Knuckle car, they designed the Hurst tribute striping. Those graphics, based on the 1969 Hurst cars, are an exact duplicate of a one year only color—Firefrost Gold. Other Hurst callouts are all over the car—logos on the Katzkin leather seats, emblems and painted (not stickers) logos on the interior and exterior, Flowmaster (a Hurst companion company under the Holley brand) exhaust system with Hurst logo tips, and of course a Hurst Billet Plus Shifter for the six speed manual transmission. Larry designed the wheels—they're a 20" forged homage to the vintage Hurst Stunner wheel. The car has been lowered about 1 ¼" front and rear with Hurst lowering springs, and the Mr. Norm's Demonic Hood features a functional scoop that feeds the Flowmaster Delta Force cold air intake on the 6.4 liter Hemi engine.

Larry and Debbie's goal for this car was to create what they believe Hurst would have built if they were still upgrading new cars. It's got the look of vintage muscle but with all of the comforts, performance and reliability of a new car. Although this car was completed last summer it hasn't been seen in public, except on the cover of Mopar Action magazine and YouTube channel My Car Story. The Challenger made its debut at the Salem Roadster Show this month to rave reviews. Go see it at the Medford Rod & Custom Show April 27 and 28—it's gorgeous!
